### Blessings from Pastor Tino | "Prepare Ye The Way"

Peace of Advent Fall Upon Our Community!

It was a time of humbleness, blessedness, great joy, and so much more. We made it Iao UCC—the Tri-Isle Association of the Hawaii Conference has officially installed me as your Pastor and what better way to celebrate such a momentous occasion than to bring new members, baptize my grandson, have my sons here with us, listen to the inspiring words from Rev. Danette Kong, and our celebration at the parsonage. {Ed.: see photo spread on pages 4-5}

Nothing could have dampened this great time of history making we have shared together with our supporting community agencies, interfaith communities, and our sister churches. I offer a special "thank you" to the many who made the installation possible.

As we begin with Advent and move into Year B in our liturgical calendar, I am excited with the anticipation of what Christmas means. Advent is a time of preparing to celebrate the birth of Jesus. But I offer this thought – let us not rush to December 25<sup>th</sup>. I walked into some of the local stores and, I kid you not, shouted "NO – it's not Christmas yet" as a kind woman behind me shouted "amen." Allow ourselves some time to reflect and celebrate what we are thankful for first. Let us prepare ye the way of our hearts – what the seasons of Advent and Christmas are all about. Reflecting on what we are called to be at a time when children are hungry and hurting, the houseless on our streets, our *kupuna* who are lonely, and the traps of consumerism (me included). I offer this in anticipation as we light each Advent candle and what to expect from our Advent liturgy:

Hope is our assurance that God will finish all God has started. He is the Prince of peace, and the fruit of His presence is peace. When Christ comes into our lives, He brings the fullness of joy. A new command I give you: Love one another, As I have loved you, so you must love one another.

This year's journey will also include another Blue Christmas as we have done in the past. I offer this in anticipation as we light all the advent candles on December 21<sup>st</sup> at 6pm: "In the spirit of this season let us now confidently ask our God for all the good things we need: For ourselves as we participate in this Christmas as special people coping with our many different losses. God, hear our prayer."

I would encourage us then to journey together, as we anticipate the celebration of the birth of Jesus, when we will sing our songs of hope, peace, joy, and love. As we journey, let us remember to get extra cans for our Maui Food Bank barrel, a toy for our youth and children on our beautiful island. As we journey, let us journey to visit our beloved shut-ins who need to feel Christ's presence in and through us. As we journey, let us not walk over our houseless on our streets, but offer a meal or a cup of water. This is who we are, Iao UCC – a church that continues to make a difference out in our communities.

I offer my prayers to each and every one of you and hope that this will be a time of preparation of and renewal, but let us not rush to December 25<sup>th</sup>.

### Nov. 12, 2017 | Rev. Floren"Tino" C. Cordova Installed at Iao UCC



The very eventful Sunday began with a protest before the morning service (see article next page), which left the congregation and its new pastor entirely undeterred — as Pastor Tino baptized his grandson, Cody Guy Cordova II, and welcomed 7 new members into the fold: Britley Case, Linda Case-Tapia, Percival Tapia, Heide Israel, Diana George, Jamie Ribao, and Shannon Furumoto (see photo below).



Rev. Robb Kojima of the The Tri-Isle Association of the Hawaii Conference, officiated at Pastor Tino's installation, with Warren Orikasa and Tim Greathouse representing the church congregation and Council.



Among the gifts Pastor Tino received was a Jewish prayer shawl from Linda Case-Tapia, who got it during a recent trip to Israel.





The climax of the very moving ceremony of installation was when the kneeling pastor was surrounded by his family, fellow Kahu, UCC/HCUCC colleagues, friends, and parishioners—each touching and connected to everyone else in the sanctuary.

The service was a blessed moment of words, music, meditation, prayer, and grace. The rest of the afternoon and early evening was a celebration at the parsonage Open House and lu'au across the street from the church.

### Love Trumps Bigotry in Wailuku

This article was submitted to the Maui News in response to a news report published in the Nov. 17 issue of the newspaper, concerning an incident at church on the morning of Sunday, Nov. 12th. (As far as we know, they did not publish this follow-up article.) The original news item is linked below, with a screenshot of the web page.

Sunday, November 12<sup>th</sup>, 2017 was a day of celebration, remembrance, and justice that lao United Church of Christ's members, friends and community will remember for a lifetime.

As it was Consecration Sunday, congregants offered their pledges in support of the church's ministries in the coming year. It was also a Sunday to remember and honor the veterans who have served and protected the nation, from the church's oldest members-Nisei soldiers in the legendary Japanese-American battalions in WW2----to the new pastor, himself a US Army veteran. A Sunday when Rev. Floren"Tino" C. Cordova had the honor to baptize his grandson, Cody Guy into the Christian faith and tradition. A Sunday in which six new people were brought into membership of the lao UCC family. A Sunday in which the church was blessed to hear Rev. Danette Kong, its Guest Steward, preach about the importance of being a church of justice and aloha as part of consecrating its gifts.

As it happens, the church service that morning was disrupted with a very loud protest by a few individuals objecting to the Open and Affirming nature of lao UCC where everyone is welcome. For half an hour, much hateful homophobic rhetoric towards the church and the LGBTQ members of its 'ohana was spewed via bullhorn from the sidewalk along Main Street; but this did not deter the faith community as they sat in the sanctuary with such joy for a momentous day of celebration. At one point, Pastor Cordova walked outside and up to the protestors, offering them bottled water, which they refused; some of the church's neighbors came outside their homes to see what the fuss was about, and objected pointedly to the protestors' hateful words and behavior.

Rev. Tino has these words to share: "We at lao UCC would like to thank all those who came out in support of us while hate was being spewed. We unite now and pray for those who despise us, that God will touch their hearts with love. No, Mr. Hall—you did not scare or intimidate our faith community. On the contrary, you have united us even more with our neighbors and with our wider community on Maui."

If the morning had not proven it was already a Christ-filled day for the church, the installation of its new pastor took place at 3 p.m. that afternoon, officiated by the Tri-Isle Association of the Hawaii Conference of the United Church of Christ. It was an aloha-filled ceremony in which the covenantal relationship between Rev. Tino as Pastor/Teacher and the faith community of lao UCC was formalized. Many kahu and lay people from the UCC on Maui and other evangelical faith denominations took part in this momentous occasion. Very specially, Rev. Tino was able to bring his partner Rong Chao; his two sons, Steven and Cody; and his grandsons Steven Alexander and Cody Guy to Maui to attend his installation. Pastor Cordova comes as an ordained minister with the Metropolitan Community Church, with standing in the Christian Church (Disciples of Christ), and has now transferred standing to the Tri-Isle Association of the Hawaii Conference UCC.

### Dec. 5, 2017 | Blessing of Watanabe Hall sign and plaque

The building that houses Iao Preschool is called Watanabe Hall, but until recently there wasn't any sign indicating its name.

It is named for **The Rev. Tamasaku Watanabe**, who served as pastor of Wailuku Japanese Christian Church (which became Iao Congregational Church, and finally Iao UCC) from 1923 to 1935.

Sometime in the summer of 2016, Rev. Watanabe's granddaughter, Gail Okawa, was on Maui and visited the church. An academic and historian by profession, Prof. Okawa shared with us the extraordinary story of what happened to her grandfather after his tenure here at the church. As it happened, Rev. Watanabe was among the several hundred Americans of Japanese ancestry from Hawaii who were detained and imprisoned at a camp on the mainland, in New Mexico ironically, where Iao's new pastor was born and raised!—during World War 2.

Over the following year, Gail kept in touch with Lloyd and the Buildings and Grounds folks who, after their encounter with Prof. Okawa, determined that it would only be fitting to have a proper sign adorn the building named for Rev. Watanabe (as is the case with both Kanda and Endo Halls; although Fujitomo Hall, where the church office is, doesn't have a sign and perhaps it, too, may be graced with one in the future).

As Prof. Okawa was scheduled to be back on Maui for a visit to the Nisei Veterans Memorial Center in early December, B&G and Pastor Tino decided to have a blessing of the new Watanabe Hall sign, as well as a plaque with a little bit of history on it, that now is affixed on a wall at Iao Preschool

On Tuesday, December 5th, just a couple of days before the 76th anniversary of the bombing at Pearl Harbor, Gail told the story of her grandfather to the Preschool children, all of whom may not have had the foggiest idea of what "World War 2" meant, but greeted their revered guest anyway with the warmth and *aloha* that preschoolers always have aplenty.
