


Beloved community, as we begin to prepare ourselves spiritually for the season of Lent and Easter, I thought it would be great for us to study the "I am" statements of Jesus. As we explore the "I Am" statements that Jesus takes onto himself, how then do we turn those statements onto ourselves and as a church. I believe that after exploring these statements, we will see why "WE ARE IAO UCC."

For this Bible Study series, we will be using a 7-week study guide by Rob Fuquay, titled "The God We Can Know."

Year-Round, 2018 | Groups & Organizations at Iao UCC

One of the ways that Iao UCC is a faithful steward to the Maui community at large is in its welcome to various local groups and organizations—making the church campus and building facilities available for meetings, classes, events and even tenantship. But more important than the money are the ongoing relationships with these groups, all of whom find great value in our church campus, and most of all the institution and community behind it.

Henry Opukaha'ia

Scholarship Fund

Henry Opukaha'ia, born in the year 1792, was one of the first native Hawaiians to become a Christian, inspiring American Protestant missionaries to come to the islands during the 19th century. Unfortunately, he died at the



young age of 26 from typhus fever while studying in Connecticut before he could return to Hawaii to preach to his people.

The Hawaii Conference United Church of Christ started a scholarship fund in honor of Henry Opukaha'ia to support the training of clergy for Christian mission.
