Aloha Summer going out to our House Churches - Friends - Supporters!

Do we feel that Pentecost Fire – Iao Church? Summer is upon us, and I assume that many of you will begin your travel plans as restrictions start to ease up a bit. Please know that we hold each of you in our prayers for safe travels as I am sure many of you have been yearning to see your families. If you have not gotten your Covid-19 shots, I encourage you to get it as soon as possible not only for your safety, but for the safety of your families, especially the most vulnerable.



As a church that is on *Holy Fire* – Iao Church continues with mission and ministry. We continue to give out food to those in need. We are transitioning to pick-up only, so if anyone needs food, please call the office at 244-7353 and we will get a bag of groceries prepared. If anyone cannot come to the church office and get the bag, we will arrange for a safe drop off as well. This month we have given out food to many in need, as well as dropping off food to the houseless encampment on Maui. We continue to thank our UCC Hawaii Conference for the generous grant to purchase food for our distribution program.



As many of you are aware, we have opened our Sanctuary for limited seating for inperson Sunday worship services. If you would like to join us for in-person Sunday Worship, please call the office so that we can get you on the list. We are still wear-

ing masks and humming our hymns, but that may change as CDC and Maui County guidelines change. We may soon return to a "somewhat" normal type of in-person worship so long as those in attendance are

fully vaccinated. Those who have not been fully vaccinated, we do not want you to feel left out, you can still join us on our Facebook live feed or 88.1 FM radio station.

The first half of this year has been a continuation of last year when it comes to gatherings. We continue with zoom meetings, zoom gatherings but that will eventually change as well. What we have learned is that many once people were able to get the hang of zooming, we had an increase in participation. This may be a new mode of having conference and association meetings for those who cannot travel, just as much as our worship services will continue using social media platforms. I was a bit saddened that Iao Church was not well represented at our UCC Hawaii Aha Pae'aina gathering from its membership and youth. Let us not fall back into the old habit of having just the Pastor at these meetings beloveds, we need your voices represented at all levels of our denomination. It cannot be the same voices all the time; we need everyone to participate, especially since we can do so from the comfort of our homes now.

UCC General Synod you asked? What did the Pastor just request above, you asked? You can still register for General Synod online beginning on July 11th and running up until the 18th. #### **Doorbuilder Fund |** *Will You Help?*

Many bargain hunters are familiar with the term "doorbuster" in retail sales. However, we currently have busted doors at lao UCC, and a Doorbuilder Fund is urgently needed. Monies were donated earlier, but electrical work for new outdoor lights took priority and depleted the fund.

The Building and Grounds crew has performed much needed repair and maintenance miracles in the past, but replacing the sanctuary's arched double doors facing north is beyond their scope. Howard Ikeda, Project Leader, reports that architect Robert Hartman is currently drawing up a plan with technical specs for replacing the doors, but it will be costly. \$30K is a realistic estimate for this project.

Dennis Hashiro warns of the damage that wood rot and termites have caused; the heavy doors are sagging and deemed unsafe. The plans call for ordering new doors, restructuring the framing, creating a new concrete landing and installing new railings. It's no wonder the project is costly but necessary. Please consider donating to the Doorbuilder Fund. We want to insure safety and a welcoming entry to our sanctuary.

#### David Murata: a Kupuna of Many Talents & Gifts | by Anna Mayeda

What is the secret of David Murata's remarkable energy at age 91? From organizing plant sales benefiting lao UCC to serving on the church's Endowment committee and supporting the Micronesian community, David's dedication to his faith is a model example for all!

For 56 years, David has been playing tennis, currently playing three days of the week. As scriptures state that people are God's creation and need to care for their body, David believes that exercise is an important way to care for one's health. Tennis provides not only physical exercise, but social, psychological and mental health experiences. The sport requires the player to respond to all types of plays and actions with different opponents, but can be played at one's own level and pace. According to David, playing tennis regularly provides all the exercise he needs and helps him to get a good night's sleep, another important habit for good health! With just the expense of a tennis racquet, balls and shoes, playing tennis is free at the public courts available throughout the island, even during the pandemic.



David's three priorities in his life are: 1. His faith and church, 2. Gardening, 3. Exercise. Through his involvement in tennis, he is able to share his faith with others since tennis is a social sport providing opportunities to build personal relationships while getting that important exercise. David states that tennis helps him to "grow." Perhaps that's the operative word in keeping active and healthy: find a sport or activity that promotes continued growth to better serve our faith!

Jody Singsank, daughter of members David and Grace Murata, planned a garage sale on May 29, 2021 at her Kula home next door to her parents. The Muratas were asked to hold a plant sale for Iao UCC since we were not able to have our bazaar where we sold plants in the past. Howard and Pamela Ikeda, and Warren Orikasa offered plants for the sale. Warren brought a car full

of a variety of plants, Howard and Pamela donated three truck loads and brought a hand truck to carry heavy plants and cash box. David had a little over a truck load of plants.

Plants were priced way below commercial cost. An example is the palm trees that were donated: a neighbor of the Muratas' who sell palm trees helped by pricing the trees and some were listed at \$160.00. We priced them at \$75.00. Howard and Pamela came up to help for two days (sale was extended four days). Pastor Tino, Rong Chao and his mom came up for the sale. According to Howard, we sold \$1,001.50, but we may have added a few more dollars.

The liturgical year is made up of six seasons:

<u>Advent</u> - four weeks of preparation before the celebration of Jesus' birth <u>Christmas</u> - recalling the Nativity of Jesus Christ and his manifestation to the peoples of the world

Lent - a six-week period of penance before Easter

<u>Sacred Paschal Triduum</u> - the holiest "Three Days" of the Church's year, where the Christian people recall the suffering, death, and resurrection of Jesus

<u>Easter</u> - 50 days of joyful celebration of the Lord's resurrection from the dead and his sending forth of the Holy Spirit

<u>Ordinary Time</u> - divided into two sections (one span of 4-8 weeks after Christmas Time and another lasting about six months after Easter Time), wherein the faithful consider the fullness of Jesus' teachings and works among his people

Each liturgical year begins on the First Sunday of Advent during the preceding calendar year
