Easter – Already?

Wow is this year going by fast or what! What a Lenten journey it has been Church! We began with Ash Wednesday as a church and then continued with this Ecumenical experiment with other faith leaders of our community. Together with St Anthony's Catholic Church, we have brought to you our Lent Theme: "In View of God's Mercy." The series has included "Mercy in Temptation, Mercy in Suffering, Mercy in Betrayal, Mercy in Relationships, and Mercy in Service." Big "thank you" goes out to Msgr. Terry Watanabe, Kahu John Tomoso, Rev. Dr. Roxanne Whitelight, and Kahu Wayne Higa for their reflection they brought based on this series. We began with just a few on March 9 and it grew to over forty these last couple of Wednesdays. This has been a great example when we can come together with our ecumenical partners and join in one accord (Honda kine) to bring God's words of comfort to all people. Keep nurturing these types of relationships Iao Church and know that while on this Christian journey we are not alone.

Our upcoming Holy Week schedule will be one that I hope you will find moving, spiritually lead, and that you are able to take some time for rest, prayer, and reflection. All worship services will be held inperson and virtually, except for Good Friday, there will only be a written liturgy and no "on screen" projection that night in the sanctuary but you can still see it via Facebook live. On Maundy Thursday, April 14th at 6:30pm we will have communion, so if you plan on joining us virtually, please gather your elements for that night. I will also be washing "stinky" feet that night to symbolize, as Jesus did with his disciples, to prepare you for the next journey ahead. Good Friday, April 15th at 7pm, we will be reading responsorial from the Gospel of John and joined by Rev. Dr. Scott Landis – Transitional Pastor at our sister Church, Keawalai Congregational Church UCC, Rev. Dr. Roxanne Whitelight – retired Lutheran Pastor, Kahu John Tomoso - Episcopal Priest, Kahu Danette Kong - Retired UCC Chaplain who will be playing the piano for us, and of course many of our Iao Youth will join us as well. Then join us for resurrection Sunday on April 17th at our 9:30am worship services.

As was revealed at our March 22nd Council meeting and March 27th Congregational meeting, I have turned in my letter of resignation, effective June 26th. Rongchao has accepted a position at the "continent," and we have made the decision to move back. This will give us an opportunity to see our grandbabies more often. These last five years has been a wonderful learning experience for me, and a great adventure filled with awe in what God has done through our ministry together. As difficult as this will be to part from one another, let us celebrate between now and then on what we have been able to do together. I truly believe there is a bright future for Iao UCC. Believe in each other, believe in your faithfulness, believe in who you are as Iao United Church of Christ. This time of transition will require a "all-hands -on-deck" until you find your next settled pastor. Rongchao and I express our deepest gratitude and love and know that we will hold each of you in our thoughts, hearts, and prayers.

We have also increased the number of times we shop at the Maui Food Bank from twice each month to nearly once each week due to the need for our unsheltered, families that are experiencing the hardships of losing employment or unable to find a job. Soon we will be including recipes for using a portion of the USDA food we distribute.



1 Tangelo


1 Tahitian Lime And

Corn Bread

(lackie uses 1/4 c butter)

Mix dry ingredients. Add the remaining ingredients, except for the butter. Pour into 9 X13 pan and bake at 350-F for 35 minutes or longer until done. Melt butter and spread over to immediately after baking.



Slow Cooker Chicken Taco Soup

Prep time:15 min Cook time: 7 hours

Servings: 8

1 onion, chopped 1 (16 ounce) can chili beans 1 (15 ounce) black beans 1 (15 ounce) can corn, drained 1 (8 ounce) can tomato sauce 1 (12 ounce) can/bottle beer 2 (10 ounce) can diced tomatoes w/green chilies, undrained

1 packages taco seasoning

3 whole boneless chicken breasts 1 cup crushed tortilla chips Optional: Cheddar cheese, sour cream

Place onion, chili beans, black beans, corn, tomato sauce, beer and dices tomatoes in a slow cooker. Add taco seasoning and stir to blend. Lay chicken breasts on top of the mixture, pressing down sightly until just covered by the other ingredients. Set slow cooker for low heat, cover, and cook 5 hours.

Remove chicken breasts from the soup and allow to cool long enough to he handled. Shred the chicken and stir back into the soup. Continue to cooking for 2 hours. Serve topped with shredded cheese, a dollop of sour cream and crushed tortilla chips. (from *allrecipes* submitted by Jackie Murai

This is included with a food box:
Almost every time we visit the Maui
Food Bank, there's usually a few items
that can be counted on being
there. One of these is USDA canned
pork. Here's a way you might want to
try using the can of pork along with
various items you may also find in your
food box. The last trip to the Maui
Food Bank I found lots of bagels! there were also heirloom carrots
and Oat Milk (it's delicious!) of course,
there was rice and canned pork as well.
BBQ pork sandwiches:

1 bagel per person*

1 can of pork-drained* (put the drained juices to the side for now)
1 small bottle of any BBQ sauce that you like.

1 small diced onion or onion flakes (optional)

In a medium size saucepan, pour 1-2 Tbs. of the drained pork juice into the saucepan and sauté the onion until soft and add the drained pork to the saucepan.

Keeping the heat at a medium to low temperature, let the pork and onion simmer for a couple of minutes. You'll probably need to break apart the pork using a couple of forks.

Once meat is soft and heated, add BBQ@ sauce into the pan. Don't make it runny with too much sauce! Place a lid on the saucepan and turn down heat to simmer.

While the pork simmers, toast bagels in a toaster, toaster oven or in a skillet remove when bagel is lightly golden. Brush both halves with olive oil, mayonnaise or butter.

You can now decide if you want your sandwich "open face" or not. Trust me, open face is better! place generous portions of pork on both halves of the bagel and enjoy. Add chilled canned fruit* or a rainbow of sliced raw carrots* and you have a meal!
