As you know, Iao Church is partners with the Maui Food Bank. During the summer the need for food goes up and the giving goes down. Please help keep Iao's food pantry full by donating a can, a box, or a jar in the container located at the entrance to Fujitomo Hall. Below is just a refresher of what the Maui Food bank does which in turn, you do when you donate food. (If you prefer to donation cash-Make your check out to "IaoUCC" and mark it for Food Bank in the memo.)

Astonishingly, over 10,000 people in Maui County have no idea where their next meal is coming from. Hunger touches people of every age, race, ethnic group, and neighborhood on our island, from the smallest *keiki* to our youth and seniors.

To address Maui's hunger issue, Maui Food Bank works through community partnerships to help collect and distribute food throughout Maui County. Maui Food Bank collects food donations from retail stores, food distributors, wholesalers, restaurants, farmers and farmer's markets, individuals and through food drives. Additional food items are purchased locally and from the mainland. Maui Food Bank is also a USDA food distributor.

Leveraging its network of over 100 partnering agencies, Maui Food Bank is able to serve 10,000 people a month who are food insecure. This includes the working poor, children and youth, seniors, the homeless, anyone who is at risk of going hungry. Maui Food Bank is even able to distributes food to the needy in rural communities of Hana, Molokai and Lanai.

In 2012, Maui Food Bank launched the <u>Aloha BackPack Buddies</u> program. Through the program, pre-filled backpacks of food are distributed to elementary school students from low income families every Friday. These backpacks contain six meals that keep children fed for weekend. Maui Food Bank annually distributes 12,120 backpacks, equivalent to 72,720 meals.

Aloha BackPack Buddies

In addition to the Aloha BackPack Buddies program, Maui Food Bank provides Maui County residents with pre-packed holiday meal boxes, annually supplies Maui's hungry with over 300,000 pounds of fresh fruits and vegetables, and delivers healthy snacks to 1,000+ Maui students each week through the Kids' Cafe program.

How You Can Help Fight Hunger on Maui Maui Food Bank is the only organization in Maui County that collects and distributes bulk quantities of perishable and non-perishable food items to Maui's hungry. Help Maui Food Bank fight hunger by:

<u>Hosting a food drive</u> at your business, school, place of worship, community service club, or in your neighborhood.

Volunteering at Maui Food Bank's warehouse, in the office, and even at special events.

SALT FOR PREVENTIVE HEALTH AND NATURAL REMEDIES

Salt can be a wonderful preventive natural remedy, especially because it is so cheap and has so many uses.

Try these **preventive health measures for salt**, a historically important food that can act as a great natural remedy. Salt is inexpensive, but it has many uses for your frugal household. Beyond its use as a food seasoning, salt has dozens of uses.

For example, salt kills weeds. It extinguishes flames, preserves colors in your wash, removes stains from coffee cups; helps clean your oven, and extends the life of many items from tooth-brushes to flowers.

Natural Health Remedies Using Salt

1. Flushing Sinuses

Although this use of salt is ancient, modern medical research has shown that flushing the sinus passages with a saline solution can help prevent/relieve sinus infections, relieve postnasal drip.

One caveat: Boil your tap water for a 3 to 5 minutes and then cool until lukewarm before using. I'd sterilize my water for any solution I planned to use in my sinuses, throat, or eyes.

For more ways to clear your sinuses, check these natural remedies for colds.

2. As an Eyewash

Dissolve 1/4 teaspoon of salt in a cup of warm water and used it as a wash for tired, irritated eyes. Be sure to boil your tap water for 3 to 5 minutes and then cool before using

3. Reducing Under-Eye Puffiness

Dissolve ½ teaspoon of salt in a cup of hot water; soak a washcloth or cotton balls in the solution, and apply to the puffy areas.

4. Cleaning Teeth

Try a mixture of salt and baking soda for your "toothpaste." Pulverize sea salt in a blender or crush it with a rolling pin, mix with an equal amount of baking soda, shake, and store in a small glass jar. Mix with a bit of water, and brush as usual. Both salt and baking soda have antimicrobial properties that kill many of the pathogenic bacteria that cause cavities and gum disease.

5. As a Gargle, Mouthwash, or Breath Sweetener

Mix a teaspoon of the tooth-cleaning mixture in a cup of warm water. (Boil your tap water for 3 to 5 minutes and then cool before using.) Find more <u>natural remedies for curing bad breath</u>.

6. Reducing Fatigue

Soak your tired feet or entire body in a warm, salt-infused bath for a restorative effect.

7. As an Exfoliant

Mix equal parts of sea salt and olive oil and rub gently over the body for an exfoliating, moisturizing scrub. Rinse with warm water. For the face, mix equal parts of salt and honey.

8. Relieving the Pain of Insect Stings Mix salt with a bit of water and apply to the sting immediately. Learn how to prevent and treat insect stings.

9. For Poison Ivy

Soak the affected areas in hot salt water to help relieve the itch and dry up blisters. Find out how to treat poison ivy



Food Boxes received peanut butter and eggs last month

Ingredients (for 25 approx.)

- 1 cup peanut butter
- ½ cup sugar
- 1 egg

Preparation

- 1. Preheat oven to 350°F (180°C).
- 2. In a large bowl, mix together the peanut butter, sugar, and egg.
- 3. Scoop out a spoonful of dough and roll it into a ball. Place the cookie balls onto a nonstick baking sheet.
- 4. For extra decoration and to make them cook more evenly, flatten the cookie balls by pressing a fork down on top of them, then press it down again at a 90° angle to make a criss-cross pattern.
- 5. Bake for 8-10 minutes or until the bottom of the cookies are golden brown.
- 6. Remove from baking sheet and cool. Enjoy!




