A few weeks ago, we were blessed with Rev. Roxanne WhiteLight filling the pulpit. Her message about being still got me thinking about my own busyness and lack of stillness. I often ponder on what my purpose is and reflect on the fact that God is still speaking but can I truly hear God if I am always busy being busy?

As long as I can remember I had to be either "doing" something or sleeping (LOL) ...there was no in between. No one taught me or modeled the behavior for being still. God's word and to listen for direction.

Sanctuary Door Update



Thank you members and friends for your generous donations to lao United Church of Christ's sanctuary front doors. We realize it has been a difficult year financially for many and for lao UCC. However due to aging, weathering and termite damage the sanctuary doors are in dire need of being replaced. Framing for the doors, a new concrete landing at the top of the steps, new hand railings, adding a center railing to help our Kupuna, and wiring for a new front door light fixture are needed to make the door safe for our members and visitors.


