Sometimes we get so busy that we forget what we are called to be as a church. Of course, we serve and minister to people, and we tend to think of that from the perspective of individuals. The mission and vision of Iao UCC is expressed in terms of what we are about as a people of God—communal terms.

The mission statement says, "We are a people of God, living and sharing the love of Christ and reflecting that love in words and actions." How do we do that? We have the food distribution on Mondays. We let Twelve-Step programs use facilities. We certainly use the property and the buildings for that mission. Is there more that we could do with all we have?

The Vision is even more provocative:

We will be a more inclusive and faithful community learning:

to give voice to the silenced,

to celebrate our commonalities,

to use God's gifts,

to bridge differences, and

to practice reconciliation.

I remember that the full name of one of our most active communities is Building and Grounds Stewardship. That means the church considers all property and buildings gifts to be used for God's mission. We are being challenged to take a hard look at all we have and all we are called to be and do. There will be challenging discussions and times of unease as we consider the way ahead may look far different from the future. Important decisions will be shared, and your participation is crucial for making good and faithful decisions. I thank God that the Church Council is beginning to address that call.

We have continued by studying parables in Luke. We have been using the artwork and some commentary from Charles McCollough's The Art of Parables: Reinterpreting the Teaching Stories of Jesus in Word & Sculpture. We will probably continue that through May. Some join in person and others join via Zoom at 7:00 p.m. Monday evenings.

Buildings and Grounds

1. Preschool tile wall:

Preschool has decided to go with Kaona Masonry Inc.

Only 1 proposal was received out of 3 requests for bids.

Cost: \$32,765 includes 4ft high plywood barricade fencing.

Update on sanctuary door:

Finishing up with the Punch List on the door. Next is the railing installation and then it should done.

3. Fujitomo Hall back door concrete steps have been redone so it is now a wider stairway to walk up on. A railing will also be installed on the left side. This will be the temporary entry while the main entry stairway is being rebuilt.

4. Waste Pro Hawaii (WPH) will be our new refuse collection company effective from May 7, 2024 for 3 years. The concrete pile from the old sidewalk will be removed and disposed by WPH at no cost.

5. Church Work Day is scheduled for Saturday May 18, 2024 from 8:00 -1:00pm. Focus will be to clean the buildings inside and outside. This used to be done every 6 months, but since Covid it stopped and we need to get it started again.

Our Associate Conference Minister Shares Reflection

Feral Roosters and Spiritual Exercises

When we first moved to Kea'au, I would get woken up by roosters crowing, and I would be so frustrated and even angry. I would toss and turn while I struggled to get back to sleep because roosters don't just crow at dawn. But one day when I was complaining about the crowing to my spiritual director, she asked me to let go of my frustration and invite God to use these interruptions as an opportunity.

I started by reflecting upon that famous story of a rooster in Matthew 26 when Peter remembered what

Jesus had said to him: "before the rooster crows, you will deny me three times." And I was inspired by how God was able to use that rooster to give a spiritual breakthrough which empowered Peter to examine himself and his relationship with God. So, I started using those interruptions when I was woken by random crowing as opportunities to work on my relationship with God.

My frustration and anger faded away. I started falling back to sleep faster. Every crow started reminding me of the love of my God who never stops call-

ing. Now, we own a flock of our own chickens including two roosters. And I have even considered adding more roosters to our choir; maybe an <u>Ayam Ketawa</u>, aka the laughing rooster or a <u>Denizli Longcrower</u>, which are famous for how long they can crow. I probably won't, but a crowing rooster is now an important aspect of my spiritual work. How is God speaking to you?
