News From The Food Pantry



We have been blessed with the help from our Kosraean Community in helping our usual drivers that include Warren, Dennis, Howard, and Daniel along with Alan, Dom and many of Dom's family members when he's not available. Not to be outdone by the men, Our Kosraean women are working Packing and distributing food along with Lynn, Pam, Dale and vacationing Anna. We couldn't manage without the help of Youlida, Catrina, Mayleen and more ladies than you can imagine just to be sup-

portive (meaning I can't remember names!)

Starting in May 2025, we will be trying out a different type of food distribution called "CHOICE". Instead of pre packing boxes or bags, there will be various stations with a volunteer at each station. These stations will offer various items for people to choose from, examples are: at the produce station there will be a variety of fresh produce to choose from. The Bakery station might have fresh bread, rolls, tortillas, etc.

Families will have a color coded card showing the size of their family and the number of choices they are allotted. Warren did an extraordinary amount of research on CHOICE talking with other agencies and the food

bank. We all basically agreed to try this type of distribution which would make life much easier and less time consuming for the men and also the women who won't need to pre-pack food.

We should have an idea by the end of May and will report back our findings. We are ALWAYS looking for more volunteers for helping to deliver food to Kanda Hall and also for volunteers to help in distribution. Once again, a big Mahalo for Warren's research!

Associate Conference Minister Jonathan Roach shares the following reflection on Holy Humor Sunday, which is the first Sunday after Easter:

Pastor: Knock, Knock! Deacon: Who's there?

Pastor: No one. Weren't you here last Sunday? The Tomb is empty!

The first Sunday after Easter is Holy Humor Sunday. For centuries churches around the world have celebrated the Sunday after Easter as Laughter Sunday or Bright Sunday or Holy Humor Sunday, which was observed by the faithful as days of joy and laughter with parties, picnics, and laughter to celebrate Jesus' resurrection. People, even clergy, played practical jokes on each other, told jokes, sang funny song, and even danced.

During the 17th century, this fun got so out of hand that Pope Clement X even officially banned it, which made it even more fun for many people. The custom was rooted in the humor of early church theologians (like Augustine, Gregory of Nyssa, and John Chrysostom) who suggested that God played a practical joke on the devil by raising Jesus from the dead. In Latin they called it, *Risus paschalis*, which literally means the Easter laugh*.

On this Second Sunday of the Easter Season let us come to celebrate our God who has a sense of humor, who gave us the gift of laughter!

Which reminds me, did you hear the one about the two deacons who went hunting and got lost?

Well, after spending the whole night lost in the woods while out hunting, the Senior Deacon tells her hunting friend, "It's almost dawn, pastor is going to be so upset if we aren't there. I'm supposed to read the scripture today."

"That's nothing," the other deacon answered, "I need to give the Stewardship Moment to kick off the capital campaign...maybe someone is looking for us now. Try shooting again, maybe they will hear us this time!"

"Okay, I'll try. But this is my last arrow!"






