

5. Proverbs 16:3 – "Commit to the Lord whatever you do, and God will establish your plans."


My prayer: May all your plans succeed as you commit them to God this month.

#### Dear Friends,

We wanted to express our deep gratitude for the return of the pride flag to your flag pole. We drive by the church many times a week between our home and town, so we see it often. We missed it when it came down, but were at least glad to see it on the building. The only problem with the building is we could only see it from one direction.

We were filled with joy when the flag returned to the pole last week. Early in our life on Maui, we were going to Iao Valley State Park. When we passed the church for the first time, with the flag flying, we knew there would be a place for us on Maui.

For those who identify as LGBTQIA+ minorities, the rainbow flag is such an portant symbol. It calls to mind a phrase from another flag song, "how proudly we hail." Thank you for standing strong with our community in times when persecution is on the rise and returning with a wild and scary surge.

We consider ourselves friends of your beloved community. Seeing this symbol reminds us of why we feel that way.

We have also been heartened by so many IAO members coming to the rallies that have been held on Maui to stand up in favor of our democracy.


