



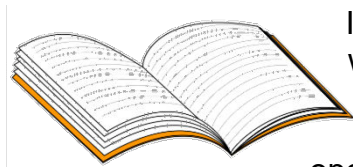

- Cynthia Snell, the vice moderator, has the ability to think three dimensionally, allowing her the skill to become a successful architect. Cynthia's contribution to the church's physical improvements is seen in her tireless work to ensure the success of the building and grounds projects, e.g., sidewalk. Her second gift is her desire to join groups; hence her willingness to take on the vice moderator's position and work on projects such as the overhauling of the church's bylaws. Without her computer skills and her willingness to sit for hours, haggling over terms and language, that project would still be lingering.
- Bryn Turner, the treasurer, has been gifted with an analytical mind, which provides proficiency with financial matters and computer tools. Her desire to contribute to the church is based on her gratitude for God's love which has enriched and blessed her life. This feeling of thanksgiving has provided stability for the church as it has gone through a number of challenges. Jackie also has the gift of taking on large tasks and to work cooperatively with people no matter how busy she might be. She has the ability to analyze a situation and is not afraid to take appropriate actions. Thanks to her gifts, the church has a person who has both the historical knowledge and the present-day insights to help the church function effectively.
- Gail Ideue, the assistant financial secretary, has also taken on many roles at our church. Presently, she is the assistant financial secretary, but she has also been the moderator and financial secretary. Gail believes God gave her the gift of work experience. As her husband's office manager, she learned to handle the financial complexities of running a business from check writing to payroll distribution. These are talents that she now uses for our church. Gail also possesses the gift of optimism. She sees hope in all situations.

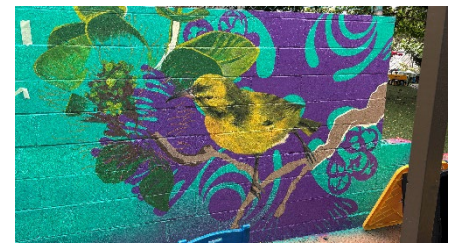


‘Īao Preschool

The Learning Community will not meet in August. The next meeting will be held September 6 after worship service in Endo Hall.

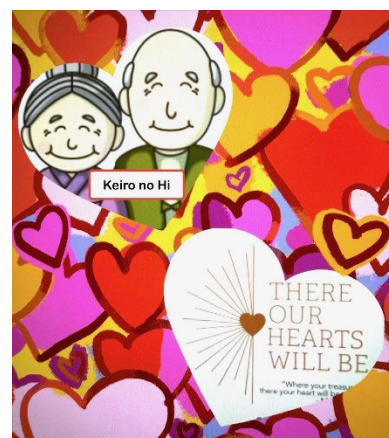
Stewarding Community

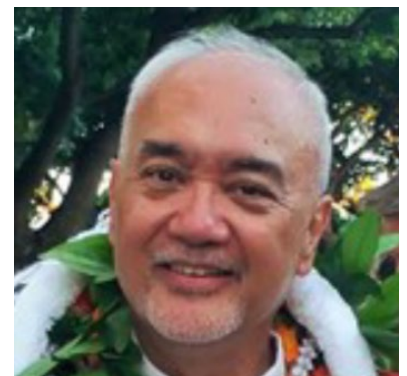
August excitement also includes the start of a new school year. We wish all our keiki success and support as they embark on new learning adventures

David Murata- A Life of Advocacy and Service



David Murata passed away peacefully on Sunday, July 19. He will be remembered as a faithful advocate for people too often living on the margins. Through his leadership at Ka Lima O Maui, he helped provide job training and employment opportunities for adults with disabilities, affirming their dignity and reminding others that everyone has gifts to contribute.

David also had a deep heart for immigrants and the Micronesian communities in Hawai'i. He helped begin the Maui Marshallese Ministry, the Chuukese Church, the Pohnpeian Church, and Kosraean Etawi here at 'Īao UCC. Beyond church starts, he advocated for Micronesian communities at the Association and Conference levels and supported families who were new to the islands.

In one example of his care, David met a family who had recently immigrated to Maui from Laos. He helped them find a home and supported the children in their schooling. Although the father had been a doctor in Laos, he was only able to work as a nurse in the United States. David encouraged the children to study hard and make the most of the opportunities before them. Today, the daughter is a doctor on the mainland, and the son is a leader in the technology industry, often lecturing around the nation.

David and Grace also owned a Christmas tree farm. One year, David invited the youth to help with the harvest—cutting, bagging, and tagging trees. By the end of the day, everyone was covered in pine needles and sap. In gratitude for their hard work, David and Grace made a generous donation to the youth group.

David cared deeply about the future of our church. He worked earnestly to begin an endowment program and invited members to consider designating a portion of their estate to support the church's ministry. He created flyers and spoke passionately about this vision. In his memory, you may wish to consider including the church in your own estate planning.

Mahalo, David, for your steadfast aloha for God and God's people.
